Dear Parents,

The run up to Christmas is gathering pace in Class 1. The children have been working hard this month and are looking forward to the holidays. Our D.T. project is nearly complete, the children have been using the polystyrene tiles that they designed and made to print repeating patterns onto fabric. The concentration and focus to do this well has been remarkable and the children are very proud of the results. The children will now need to decide what they are planning to make with their fabric and will continue this into next term.







Thank you for having Sunny the Meerkat to stay over the last few weeks. This experience has meant that the Class 1 children have been able to produce some lovely writing based on real experiences. They have been working on different types of sentences, as well as indicating time within their writing. They hope to share some of this writing with you at sharing assembly. Thank you so much for all your effort with Class 1's children's homework. It really does make a difference in increasing their self-esteem, gives them pride in their work and allows them to develop skills and knowledge that they have been taught in school.

The children have been busy making a sculpture for a display at Exeter Cathedral. Miss Watts took it down last weekend and told us that she was really proud of how lovely it looked amongst the entries from other schools. Well done everyone. If you are in Exeter, please go and have a look at the beautiful displays. The exhibition was launched on 31st November and runs over the Christmas period.

As part of their local study work this term, Class 2 have been looking at the artwork of Totnes based artist Yvonne Coomber. They have used some of her scratching, dotting and splashing techniques and discovered the range of colour used to portray emotion in her paintings.

They have used this work as inspiration for their remembrance poppy artwork which was displayed at our remembrance service at Broadhembury war memorial. Thank you to all of those that attended.







For 'Ready, Steady, Write!' this term, the Class 2 children explored the folk song 'Widecombe Fair'. They researched the traditions of Widecombe Fair, its location on Dartmoor and the activities that go on there at the exciting annual event. The children listened to the traditional song, looked at the rhythm, tempo and used instruments to sing along. Next, the children held their own 'Broadhembury Fair' where there was a cake stall, tombola, book stall, ring toss and a pet show. In the afternoon, children wrote poems in the style of 'Widecombe Fair'. They looked at the vocabulary and rhyming patterns in the poem and recreated their own poems using their experiences from 'Broadhembury Fair'.







On Friday 22nd November Broadhembury held its second Vision Day based on our vision statement 'Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire'. The children shared their talents and new things they are doing that they are proud of and wrote them down on the flames shown below. As a school, the children then thought about how they could share the school vision in the community. The children made beautiful Christmas cards and invitations to our Christmas carols in the square, which they plan to deliver by hand around the village.

Wellbeing


