Dear Parents,

On Wednesday the children in Class 2 joined the children from Farway and Branscombe for a trip into Exeter to visit various places of worship, the outing included visits to Exeter Cathedral, Exeter Mosque and South Street Baptist Church. The purpose of the activity was to develop the children's understanding of the culture and beliefs of others and to support our class work on identifying similarities and differences between religions as well as between denominations within a religious group.









The children really enjoyed the visit and the follow up work they have been doing shows that they were really inspired by the day. Some quotes from the children this morning; "My favourite part was the cathedral because it was so big and full of interesting facts", "I really enjoyed meeting up with the other children from the federation".

The school Ethos Team also went on a visit this week to Sidmouth CE Primary School. They met other Church School Ethos Teams there too and had a lovely day discussing the shared value of "Friendship". The day began with an icebreaker quiz, where the children were challenged to chat to and find out about someone they did not previously know. We then began to think about the value of Friendship in small groups, before dividing into 4 groups to work with children from other schools, taking part in a carousel of 4 activities: making a special "Herman" friendship cake, writing a recipe for friendship, making a clay friendship circle and discussing how we can be a good or bad influence on our friends, then writing prayers on the subject. The day then finished with a short time of reflection and prayer led by local vicar, Mark Barrett. The children came back enthused by the day and keen to share their ideas with other children in the school.



Lieutenant Baden-Powell was a brave soldier in the British Army and served in India and Africa. He was an expert in wilderness survival skills, like hunting, making fires and building rafts. To help new soldiers he wrote a small manual. A version of this became 'Scouting for Boys' and gave him the idea of setting up the Scouting movement.
