PRESENTATION

Farm shop, weekly cooking & tasting

Mathematical Development

The children will begin to build on skills learnt last year. Year 1 will be focussing on a deeper understanding of number and place value, whilst Year 2 will be developing skills such as problem solving using their skills of reasoning and their increasing mathematical fluency.

Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing

The children will continue to learn and perform texts using story mapping amongst other things. This helps them develop their speaking skills and provides opportunities through focussed teaching sessions to create their own written pieces using taught writer techniques, grammar and spelling.

Possible Activities

- Weekly journal writing
- Little Red Hen
Traditional tale with a moral
Instructions to make bread (factual)
- Farmer Duck by Martin Waddell
Factual recount
- The Jolly Christmas Postman by Allan Ahlberg and Janet Ahlberg
Letter writing linked to ICT (emails to schools in Australia)
- How to catch Santa by Jean Reagan
Instructions to catch Rudolph (fictional)
- Learning songs for the Nativity

Possible Activities

- Using Numicon, money and pairs of other real life objects to count in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10 forwards and backwards
- Finding numbers to match a given criteria when given clues
- Matching numerals to words and learning ordinal numbers
- Placing numbers on the numberline
- Finding the cost of 2 or more items and giving change in our Farm Shop.
- Partitioning 10, 20 and 100 to practise number facts and developing mental fluency
- Practising our problem solving using real-life situations such as our Farm Shop or Home corner.

Possible Activities

- Harvests around the world customs and traditions
- Exploring food packages and labels placing these on the world map (Food miles)
- Making corn dollies
- Baking a harvest loaf and vegetable soup
- Sorting and describing food using the 5 senses
- Being plant detectives
- Keeping a seasonal diary
- Taking care of ourselves and staying healthy by washing our hands and cleaning our teeth

Geography, History, Science

Our focus will be where in the world our food comes from as well as the labelling of food. We will be investigating the changing of the seasons as well as taking care of our bodies.

THE VISIT/VISITOR

- Local farm visit
- Visit from a dentist or nurse

PE, growth and health

We are starting the year with different ways of moving and spatial awareness as well as jumping, skipping and balance.

Possible Activities

- We will be creating moves for the song Dingle Dangle Scarecrow, as well as creating our own Wake & Shake routines as part of our Good Samaritan award.
- Gymnastics – moving between balances.

Art, Music, DT & Role Play

We will be using our senses and observational skills to study and imitate 6 different artists. We will then be creating our own pieces influenced by these artists.

Possible Activities

- Baking, cooking and tasting
- Design and make food packaging
- Study Arcimboldo
- Food as art
- How artists see food
- Perform traditional rhymes and songs linked to food and farming at harvest
- Observational drawings and comparisons of old and new farming machinery.
- Nativity

Understanding of Faith Belief and Cultures

Our theme this term is celebrations across the world and in different faith groups. We will be investigating Harvest celebrations around the world and continuing our Good Samaritan Challenges – watch out for them coming home soon. Central to all of our thinking will be British Values.

Possible Activities

- We will be creating our Class Charter and agreeing it amongst ourselves.
- In RE, we will be celebrating festivals and marking special days about the world around us and in different faiths. In particular we will be looking at Harvest and Christmas as Christian Festivals and Eid as a Muslim Festival.
- Christmas decorations
- During Anti-bullying week (November 13th – 17th) we will be looking to make a leaflet about how we recognise and tackle bullying in school.
- We will also be using our time to think about being responsible and thinking about our actions.

ICT Activities

- We will be learning how to use technology respectfully and safely to retrieve, save and share information for our Christmas around the world presentation using PowerPoint.
- We will be developing our keyboard skills and hope to be able to link via email with children at a school in Australia
- We will continue to use Bug Club to develop reading and comprehension skills and Bug Club Club will continue to run on a Thursday lunch time.
